## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to observe, assess and help children make progress from their starting points. She knows how to plan activities and play experiences to help children move onto their next steps of learning.
- The childminder knows what to do if she was worried about a child, including the procedures to follow to report any concerns about their welfare. She undertakes risk assessments to help keep children safe in her care.
- The childminder understands how to teach children about the boundaries and rules to help support their positive behaviour. For example, she would discuss with children the need to respect each other's views and be respectful.
- The childminder understands how to establish partnerships with parents and other settings that children attend and share information about children's progress.
- The childminder is reflective in her practice and keeps up-to-date with training and legislation to help improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at documents provided by the childminder.
- The inspector viewed the premises used for childminding and the available play resources.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of meeting children's learning and development needs.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of safeguarding.
- The inspector looked at documents provided by the childminder.
