Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The leadership team and staff understand how to provide an enjoyable range of activities for children after school to help complement their day at school.
- The leadership team recognises the importance of self-evaluation to help them identify any further areas for improvement. They understand the benefits of having effective systems in place to monitor practice and providing staff with regular professional development opportunities.
- The leaders and staff understand the importance of keeping parents well informed about the time children spend at the club. There are procedures in place to exchange information with parents, in order to identify and support children's individual needs.
- The leaders and staff understand the importance of working in partnership with the schools the children attend. Systems focus on ensuring children will be emotionally and socially well prepared for their transfer and develop close relationships with staff.
- The leadership team is aware of their responsibility to protect children from harm. They ensure staff undertake regular training and understand the signs of possible abuse and neglect. Staff know the procedures to follow if they have a concern about a child's welfare.
- The leaders and staff knows how to place a good priority on helping children to respect each other and consider others' feelings. There are clear guidelines for behaviour and conduct to help promote children's emotional well-being.
- Staff know how to promote healthy lifestyles for children. They have a clear understanding of how to provide healthy and nutritious snacks and physical activities daily. They have clear understanding and procedures in place to help children keep themselves safe when they are at the club and travelling to the club from school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the owners and staff how they intend to deliver activities for children.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the owners and viewed documentation they will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises to be used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the owners and staff and took into consideration the suitability checks.

Twilight At Churchtown was registered in 2015 and is privately owned by Twilight Hours Partnership. The club opens Monday to Friday, term time only. Sessions are from 3.30pm until 6pm. The club employs five members of staff. Of these, three hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3.
