**Overall outcome** 

The school is likely to meet the relevant independent school standards if the material change relating to the school provision is implemented

### **Main inspection findings**

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 7(a), 7(b), 11, 12, 14, 16, 16(a), 16(b)

- The school's safeguarding policy has a link to the recent statutory guidance 'Keeping children safe in education' (September 2016), and also has links to safeguarding websites for the seven local authorities that place pupils at the school. The safeguarding policy is adequate but does not fully reflect all the measures the school takes to keep pupils safe from harm or risk of harm. For example, the school has produced a very helpful aide-memoire of actions for staff to do, or that they must not do, when faced with potential safeguarding issues and this is not included in the policy.
- The safeguarding policy is also linked to the school's personal, social and health education policy. There are further school policies and procedures that include safeguarding topics. For example, bullying, cyber bullying, managing relationships and the 'Prevent' duty. These additional policies are designed to protect pupils from harm, reduce risk of harm and to educate pupils to keep themselves safe in school, and in their homes and communities.
- Safeguarding issues are a key feature of daily briefing meetings and weekly staff meetings. This close monitoring enables leaders to identify difficulties quickly and to put workable interventions in place to diffuse or deflect escalation when behaviour threatens to deteriorate. As a result, the school is a calm and safe place for pupils to be. No safequarding issues arose during the inspection.
- Leaders ensure that pupils are properly supervised throughout their school day. Risk assessments are made on pupils' needs and regularly updated. In some instances, these risk assessments determine that staffing levels reach two adults to one pupil. In this way, leaders ensure the safety of pupils and staff and that learning can take place.
- The school has a health and safety policy in place and fire safety log books show that the premises are inspected regularly and certificates are kept in the fire safety files.



- The proposed increase in pupil numbers will not adversely affect these arrangements.
- The school is likely to meet all the requirements in this part providing the potential risks continue to be closely monitored and appropriately managed.

- The single central register is maintained by administrative staff and overseen by the proprietors.
- All required checks are made and recorded in electronic format.
- All staff are UK citizens.
- Staff are not appointed until they meet all requirements.
- When supply staff are required, the school uses one provider and a regular group of teachers. This approach provides an element of continuity and familiar relationships that helps those pupils who struggle with change.
- All required checks on the supply provider are in place.
- Staff files include checklists that demonstrate the use of safer recruitment procedures.
- The school is likely to meet all the requirements for this standard if the Department for Education (DfE) approve the implementation of the material change.

#### Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

- The school operates over three sites with one currently dedicated to post-16 students.
- Collectively, the three sites provide adequate accommodation for the needs of its pupils and offer school leaders flexibility in placing pupils in the most suitable setting.
- School leaders have ensured that the premises are well kept and safe, and satisfy the requirements of this standard.
- There is sufficient space for the increase in numbers because school leaders are flexible and responsive to pupils' needs, and place pupils appropriately.
- The school has access to four different sports centres for physical education where shower and changing facilities are provided.



■ The school is likely to meet all the requirements for this standard if the Department for Education approve the implementation of the material change.

### Part 8. Quality of leadership in and management of schools

- Leaders have been communicating with the Department for Education to increase numbers and believed they had already obtained approval in principle to proceed with the increase in numbers. Therefore the school is catering for 19 pupils plus a pupil who is an emergency placement for which there has been DfE approval.
- The school has not made any further changes to its registration arrangements without the required approval from the Department for Education.
- School leaders have the skills and knowledge, and take the necessary steps needed, to ensure that the independent school standards are being met consistently.
- School leaders are dedicated to providing a safe and productive learning environment in which pupils can thrive personally and academically.
- The school is likely to meet all the requirements for this standard if the DfE approve the implementation of the material change.

#### Information about this school

- Independent Educational Services is an independent day school with three sites situated in Nuneaton and Atherstone.
- Pupils are placed at the school by seven local authorities.
- The school is registered for 17 pupils and is seeking approval for 19 pupils.
- All pupils have a statement of special educational needs or an education, health and care plan.
- Four pupils are children in care.



- Currently, one of the sites is dedicated for post-16 students of whom there are four.
- The school utilises a range of other providers including local libraries, sports centres and vocational organisations to extend the curriculum experiences for pupils.



### Information about this inspection

- This inspection was carried out by Ofsted at the request of the registration authority, the Department for Education. The school applied for a material change in respect of proposals to increase the registered numbers on roll from 17 to 19.
- This inspection was conducted in one day with two days' notice.
- The inspector met with the proprietors and members of staff with key administrative responsibilities. She visited the three sites and reviewed a range of relevant documentation including: safeguarding; health and safety; risk assessment and accessibility policies; fire safety certificates; the single central register; and staff files. In addition, the inspector audited the premises and accommodation for compliance against the independent school standards in respect of the material change.
