Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to keep children safe. She knows what action to take if she had any concerns about children's welfare. She attends regular training to help keep her knowledge up-to-date.
- The childminder understands how to support children's learning and development. She has a range of resources and knows how to keep the environment safe for children.
- The childminder plans to teach children about the importance of healthy lifestyles and appropriate behaviour. She knows her role in helping to support and prepare children for their future learning.
- She recognises the importance of planning suitable activities to help children make progress in their learning and development. The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and others who may be involved in the care of children.
- The childminder knows how to use reflection and evaluation to monitor her practice and make plans for ongoing development and improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she would observe, assess and plan to help children make progress in their learning.
- The inspector viewed areas of the house and garden used for childminding.
- The inspector sampled relevant documentation, including suitability checks.
