Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not evaluate to identify areas for development to meet requirements. She has not maintained her first aid qualification and does not hold public liability insurance, as required. These are also breaches of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of child protection procedures and knows how to raise concerns to relevant agencies to help keep children safe.
- The childminder knows that children learn and develop in different ways. She understands how to observe and assess children's development to support their next stage of learning.
- The childminder recognises the need to work in close partnerships with parents and other professionals to help provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting positive behaviour and teaching children to be respectful of differences between themselves and others.
- The childminder understands the benefits of helping children lead a healthy lifestyle, such as, spending time outdoors, being active and eating healthily.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

The childminder registered in 2014. She lives in Walton-on-Thames, Surrey. The childminder operates Tuesday and Thursday from 9.30am to 5.30pm, all year round, except for family and Bank holidays. There were no children on roll at the time of the inspection.
