The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is knowledgeable about safeguarding legislation and child protection issues. She understands her role and responsibility to protect children from harm.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's progress to enable them to successfully move on to school. She is knowledgeable about how to plan and provide age-appropriate, challenging activities to support the different areas of children's learning.
- The childminder shows a good understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents. She explains ways to encourage parents to share information about their child, in order to support continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour in a positive way. She understands how to ensure that children learn to respect and tolerate each other's differences.
- The childminder is well motivated and maintains her professional development. She knows how to evaluate her practice and how to plan ways in which to improve this.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
