The provision meets requirements

- The provider is aware of their responsibility to safeguard children. They ensure staff understand the signs that would give them cause for concern. The provider and staff know the process to follow to report any child protection concerns.
- The provider and staff understand how to provide a range of activities for children after school, and during some holidays, to help complement their school life.
- Staff understand how to supervise children and encourage them to independently lead their play using the available resources and activities.
- Staff know how to provide healthy snacks and meals to support children's well-being. They understand how to help children manage their behaviour.
- The provider and staff recognise the importance of evaluating their practice. Staff have regular one-to-one meetings and frequent opportunities for training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Boughton Early Birds operated by TJ Daycare out of school club registered in 2011. It operates from Boughton Primary School, in Northampton. The club employs five members of childcare staff. Of these two hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3 and above, including the provider with qualified teacher status. The club opens from Monday to Friday, during term time and occasionally during some school holidays. Sessions are from 7.45am to 9am and 3.30pm to 6pm, apart from Friday when sessions end at 5.30pm. During some school holidays, the club operates daily from 8.30am to 6.30pm. There were no children in the early year's age range on roll at the time of inspection.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
