## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to provide suitable resources, activities and experiences to support children's learning and development. She knows how to monitor children's progress and prepare them for the next stages in their learning.
- The childminder knows how to provide a secure, child friendly and welcoming environment for children.
- The childminder knows how to help children develop healthy lifestyles. For example, through opportunities for physical play and providing a healthy diet.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and professionals from other settings children attend, in order to provide a shared approach to children's learning.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She knows what steps to take if she has a concern about a child. She understands the required documentation she needs to maintain to protect children's welfare.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to making continuous improvement. For example, she completes training and research to keep her knowledge up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed all areas of the premises available to children.
- The inspector discussed the requirements of the early years foundation stage with the childminder, including how she monitors children's progress.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she implements the safeguarding and welfare requirements
- The inspector looked at polices and documents the childminder uses when childminding.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she self-evaluates her service.
