Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is clear about how to keep partnerships with parents and other providers strong to help promote consistency and continuity for children's development. She understands how to share information and keep parents well informed.
- The childminder has suitable resources that are stored effectively to enable children to select their own play activities.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to value and respect others. She knows how to encourage good behaviour and understands how to support children's emotional development and help them feel safe and secure.
- The childminder understands how to ensure that children are protected, including undertaking risk assessments to help make sure that the premises is safe. She knows how to identify signs raising concerns about a child's welfare and how to report them.
- The childminder understands how to plan activities, based on children's interests and individual needs, to help them make progress. She knows how to use assessments to target the next steps in each child's learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's home that she plans to use for children's care.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including policies, procedures and suitability checks for adults living in the household.
