- The childminder understands how to use observation and assessment of children's learning to plan activities that will challenge and encourage their ongoing progress.
- The childminder knows how to provide enjoyable learning experiences to help children make progress from their starting points.
- The childminder understands the importance of ensuring that children receive a healthy diet and regular exercise to promote their well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in close partnership with parents and other early years settings that children attend.
- The childminder understands how to help children learn to respect one another. She knows how to promote their self-esteem, good behaviour and independence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The childminder registered in 1997. She operates her provision all year round from 7am to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds an appropriate qualification at level 3.
