Summary of key findings for parents

This provision is good

- Staff create an exceptional nurturing environment. Children build strong attachments to staff and with each other. Children show they feel secure and are very happy.
- Staff develop expert knowledge of how to promote children's interests in books and stories. Their strategies to support learning at home in this area are highly successful and worthy of dissemination to other providers. Children show high levels of interest and understanding of stories and books.
- Children who learn English as an additional language receive well-targeted support. They quickly learn to speak to a good standard in English.
- Staff work highly effectively with other professionals and parents to quickly identify and close gaps in children's learning.
- Leaders and managers place a high focus on the professional development of staff. As a result, some staff are highly qualified and the quality of teaching is constantly improving.

It is not yet outstanding because:

- Staff are less knowledgeable about how to support pre-school children's emerging interest in writing recognisable letters.
- Staff do not always sharply focus on incorporating children's next steps in learning during daily activities. This means activities do not consistently provide children with opportunity to make rapid progress.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

- help staff to develop their knowledge of how to support pre-school children's emerging interest in writing recognisable letters
- make sure staff provide consistent opportunities during daily activities for children to achieve their next steps in learning to help them make rapid progress.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed children at play and assessed the quality of interactions between staff and children.
- The inspector completed a joint observation of an activity with the manager.
- The inspector held a number of discussions with the management team and staff. She looked at relevant documentation and evidence of the suitability of persons working in the nursery.
- The inspector spoke to children during the inspection.
- The inspector spoke to parents and took account of the views.

Inspection findings

Effectiveness of the leadership and management is good

The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. Staff are vigilant at all times. They make sure children are safe and secure as they play. Managers and staff undertake ongoing child protection training and know what action to take if there are concerns about a child's welfare. Staff recruitment, induction and ongoing suitability checks ensure all adults are suitable to work with children. Managers are reflective practitioners who are always seeking to improve practice and outcomes for children. They seek and act on the views of children and parents. They monitor children's progress very closely and use this information well to identify areas for improvement in teaching. As a result, managers have provided further training for staff to help them to increase their knowledge of how to promote children's interest in number, shape, size and measure.

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good

Staff continually create new and stimulating experiences to motivate children to follow their own interests and become independent and confident learners. Pre-school children use the knowledge they have gained from books to plant seeds and flowers in pots. They look closely and learn to correctly name features, such as roots, stems, leaves and flowers. Staff who work with children aged two years and under focus really well on showing children how to use and play with the vast range of resources within the nursery. Children under two years learn how to use containers to collect water from the outdoor tap, which they use to wet brushes and make marks on the ground. Staff are skilled in modelling and promoting children's communication skills.

Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

The highly effective organisation within the nursery and caring staff effectively supports children's well-being. Parents see this is as a main strength of the nursery and report that their children thrive in staff's care. Children develop a secure sense of belonging. They benefit from continuity in their care when they first start the nursery and when they move rooms as they get older. Staff prepare children well for their move to school. They encourage them to talk about their feelings and to become familiar with the changes that will take place. Staff continually model welcoming, friendly behaviour. Children are friendly and helpful to each other. Children spend lots of time being physically active.

Outcomes for children are good

Children develop the key skills they need for future learning and the move to school. Children who have special educational needs make good progress in their learning. Children are active learners. They show high level of fascination and curiosity. They are motivated to find out why and how things happen. They become confident and competent communicators who enjoy following their own interests.
