Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows the procedures to follow if she has any safeguarding concerns regarding the safety and welfare of children in her care. She understands the importance of risk assessments to help to identify hazards in the environment.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of working with parents and other professionals to help to provide continuity for children's care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and plan for children's continuous learning and development. She recognises the importance of providing activities and experiences to help to interest and motivate children to learn. The childminder is aware of how to help children to become confident and independent.
- The childminder knows how to support children's health, physical and emotional well-being. She is aware of how to promote inclusion and positive behaviour, and the importance of teaching children to take turns, share and respect others.
- The childminder recognises the value of evaluating her practice to help to identify her strengths and areas for development and improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector toured the premises and discussed how the childminder will ensure children are safe at all times in her care. The inspector also viewed resources that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
