Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to assess, plan and support children's learning to challenge them and help them to make progress in all areas of learning and development.
- The childminder has attended safeguarding training and knows the correct procedures to follow should she have concerns about a child's welfare. She is aware of the signs and symptoms to be aware of which may cause concern.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children to learn positive behaviour and gain independence.
- The childminder understands the importance of maintaining a safe and stimulating environment. She provides suitable resources and premises for childminding.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her service and recognises the value of updating her skills and knowledge.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents and other settings that the children attend, to help meet their needs and promote continuity of learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder the safeguarding and welfare requirements, and looked at evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other adults living at the premises.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for the children and undertake observations, assessment and planning.
- The inspector looked at the areas used for childminding and discussed resources and equipment.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder that she intends to use when caring for the children.
