## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision does not meet requirements

- Safeguarding is not effective. Staff do not have a suitable understanding of child protection issues. They are unable to explain the different types of abuse, possible indicators or what they would do if there were concerns about staff in the setting.
- Through discussion, staff demonstrate a suitable understanding of how to promote children's enjoyment and meet their needs. Staff have a strong partnership with the school so that they can complement and support any learning needs.
- Staff demonstrate a sound understanding of how to help children to understand the expectations. They explain how the club rules are similar to those within the school to ensure there is a consistent approach. They display nominations for good behaviour to encourage children to behave well and help others.
- Staff understand the importance of ensuring the premises are safe. They demonstrate how they manage the safe use of the indoor and outdoor space.
- The manager maintains required documents and information, such as accident records. She describes how they evaluate practice to identify how they can improve the club.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

# What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

ensure that all staff have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding 15/06/2017 issues and can identify signs of possible abuse and neglect.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector reviewed the areas used by children both indoors and outdoors.
- The inspector spoke to the manager, staff and nominated person during the inspection.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the club uses when caring for children including evidence of the suitability of adults working with children.
- The inspector discussed the club's evaluation procedures with the manager.
- The inspector spoke to parents and carers of older children attending the club and took account of their views, including their feedback from the club's recent questionnaire.

Play & Learn at Breadsall Hill Top Infant School registered in 2009. It is one of four clubs run by Play and Learn Before and After School Club Ltd. It operates from a room within Breadsall Hill Top Primary School, Derby. The club is open from 7.45am to 8.45am and 3.15pm to 6pm Monday to Friday term time only. The club employs four members of staff. The manager is a qualified teacher, two staff are qualified to level 3 and one to level 2.
