Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to protect the children in her care. She is aware of signs and symptoms that may cause a concern and knows how to report these. She recognises the importance of keeping her environment safe.
- The childminder knows how to observe, plan and assess children's learning and provide stimulating activities to support them in their future learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children to develop positive behaviour and respect for others. She describes how she will encourage children's independence to promote future learning.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children to develop healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder knows the importance of working in partnerships with parents and other settings that children attend to ensure a consistent approach to children's care and learning.
- The childminder demonstrates her commitment to improving her practice. She describes how she will attend training to improve her knowledge and skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector took account of parents' views through written accounts.
- The inspector looked around the home that will be used for childminding.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation and viewed evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other adults living at the premises.
