### Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have valid public liability insurance. This is also breaches a requirement of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder's home is not suitable. The walls and floors are not kept sufficiently clean to maintain children's health and physical well-being.
- The childminder keeps her knowledge of how to safeguard children current and is aware of how to report any concerns about their welfare.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of keeping her practice current. For example, she completes online training and is studying for a degree in early years to help update her knowledge and skills.
- The childminder knows how to encourage and support children's physical development.
- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's abilities. She understands how to plan activities that help support children to make progress in all areas of the curriculum.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
