## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The providers and staff carry out daily risk assessments indoors and when collecting children from schools to minimise potential risks to children's safety. The premises is free from hazards. They keep and maintain relevant records, as required.
- The providers demonstrate their understanding of child protection matters and the procedures to follow if they suspect a child is at risk of harm and in the event of an allegation being made against a member of staff. The providers recognise the importance of supporting staff's childcare skills and to improve the provision for children.
- The providers understand how to support children's health and physical well-being.
- The providers know how to organise space, time and resources to support children in their play.
- The providers have strategies in place for managing children's behaviour and teaching them to respect others similarities and differences.
- The providers understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and teachers at the school to support consistency of care for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the providers about their practice.
- The inspector went on a tour of the premises with the providers to observe the areas used for childcare purposes.
- The inspector looked at a sample of documentation, including the providers' qualification and training certificates, policies and the public liability insurance certificate.

Vibrant Minds After School Club registered in 2015. It is situated in Silvertown in the London Borough of Newham. The club opens Monday to Friday from 3pm to 6pm during term time. The providers employ three members of staff. Of these, two hold qualifications in childcare at level 2 and level 3.
