Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has recently completed safeguarding training to ensure her knowledge relating to child protection is up to date. The childminder understands her responsibilities to protect children and promote their well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents, to provide consistent care and learning for children.
- The childminder knows how to provide a safe environment. She has completed risk assessments of her home and measures are in place to minimise risks.
- The childminder provides a range of toys and play materials to support children's learning and development. She explains how she intends to provide a stimulating environment where children will be engaged in age-appropriate activities.
- The childminder understands how to support children's learning by completing regular assessments of progress and planning activities to support development.
- The childminder explains how she will make use of the local community to extend children's understanding of the world around them.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector toured the areas of the premises to be used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.

The childminder registered in 2010. She lives in Manchester. She operates her provision all year round from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.
