## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice to improve quality. She intends to involve parents to help her identify areas for improvement.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to monitor the progress that children make and identify what they need to learn next. She intends to use observation and assessments to help her plan for children's progress.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She can demonstrate that she knows how to provide a safe environment for children.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents to maintain continuity for the children. She intends to gain information about development when children first start and offer ideas and resources for parents to use at home.
- The childminder knows how to help children learn about the differences and similarities between themselves and others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector looked at documents the childminder will use when caring for children and reviewed evidence of the suitability checks for all adults living in the household.
- The inspector and childminder toured the areas of the premises where childcare is to be provided.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed toys, resources and equipment that she intends to use.
