Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice effectively. She plans to involve parents and children in helping her identify areas for improvement.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of how to keep children safe from harm. She has attended safeguarding training and knows how to maintain a safe environment.
- The childminder has very good knowledge of how to develop children's appreciation of diversity and how to promote inclusion. She plans to teach children to share, take turns and be kind to each other.
- The childminder understands the significance of maintaining very good partnerships with parents and other childcare professionals.
- The childminder plans to prepare and provide a wide range of stimulating opportunities for the children in which to take part. She wants children to have an exciting and interesting time with her.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
