## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of child protection. She knows the signs and symptoms that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare and the procedures to follow to report these.
- The childminder recognises her responsibilities to work in partnership with parents, professionals and other settings to help meet children's needs consistently.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows how to plan activities which are based on children's interests and individual needs. She understands how to use assessments to target the next steps in each child's learning and help prepare them for their future learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to value and respect others. She knows how to support children's awareness of good behaviour and to help them learn about the wider world.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's well-being, such as by encouraging healthy lifestyles and teaching children about how to keep themselves safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
