Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements and how to implement these in her childminding to promote positive outcomes in children's care and learning.
- The childminder demonstrates that she has arrangements in place for monitoring and observing children's progress, to identify where they are at in their development and to identify any gaps in children's learning.
- The childminder understands her role in safeguarding children and how to promote their personal development, behaviour and well-being.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children to develop the skills they need to prepare for their future learning and school.
- The childminder uses regular training to keep her knowledge and skills up to date. She understands the benefits of reflecting on her service and evaluating her practice, to identify aspects of her provision that may need improving.
- The childminder understands how partnership working with parents and other professionals and providers, promotes consistency in children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector observed the areas within the home to be used for childminding.
- The inspector engaged in discussions with the childminder.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's documentation and certificates of qualifications, including first aid, safeguarding training and insurance documents.

The childminder registered in 2006. She lives in the Walthamstow area, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest. The childminder offers flexible hours, Monday to Friday from 7.30am to 6.30pm, throughout the year. There were no children on roll at the time of this inspection.
