## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to help safeguard children and knows how to report any concerns she may have about children's welfare to the correct authorities. She explains how she would minimise risks to children and help them learn how to manage their own safety.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children about how to maintain their good health. She describes how she will prepare children for school and help them to manage their behaviour appropriately.
- The childminder explains how she will use information from parents, as well as her own observations and assessments of children's learning, to provide activities that promote children's good progress. She understands the importance of working in partnership with others to help promote continuity for children's progress and well-being.
- The childminder explains why it is important to reflect on her practice and identify her professional development needs, as part of the processes for promoting continuous improvement in the quality of provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
