Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- Although the childminder has registered to attend appropriate first-aid training soon, she has not maintained a current paediatric first-aid qualification, following the recent expiry of her existing certificate on 16 July 2017, to ensure she is able to act appropriately to treat children in the event of an accident or emergency.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan exciting and stimulating activities that help to ensure children make good progress and are prepared for school.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She can identify signs which would give her cause for concern about a child's welfare and knows how to refer any concerns to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being. She understands the benefits of a healthy lifestyle and the importance of providing nutritious food and regular opportunities for physical activity outdoors.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents, other settings and other professionals to provide consistency in children's learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further
