The provision meets requirements

- The childminder recognises the benefits of completing risk assessments on her premises and for outings, and for teaching children how to keep themselves safe. She is clear about the procedures to follow if she is concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the requirements for completing assessments on children, including providing suitably challenging play and learning opportunities that support their individual progress towards the early learning goals.
- The childminder has a wide range of play and learning resources and equipment suitable for children from birth to under eight.
- The childminder recognises the benefits of working in partnership with parents and others involved with children to ensure they receive consistent support.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyle habits, such as the value of eating well-balanced meals, of physical activity and enjoying fresh air.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she intends to support children's learning and development, and meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including those relating to safeguarding practices and the childminder's suitability to work with children.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the premises, including furniture and equipment, and she assessed the childminder's understanding of providing appropriate resources for children's different stages of development.
