The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health by providing balanced meals and healthy snacks and opportunities for daily physical exercise, rest or sleep.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's development. She understands how to observe and assess children's achievements to plan for their further learning and to prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents to promote all aspects of children's learning and care. She has considered how she would work with other providers to meet children's learning needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of reviewing her provision. She seeks regular training opportunities to maintain her professional development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
