The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to review and monitor her provision to identify and make improvements for children. Since the last inspection, the childminder has addressed the actions. She understands how to meet the learning and development requirements.
- The childminder understands how to observe, assess and plan activities to engage children and help them move on to their next stage of learning. She understands how to complete the progress check for children aged between two and three years.
- The childminder understands her role and responsibilities in keeping children safe and protecting them from harm and extreme views. She is aware of the possible signs and knows the procedures to follow in the event of a concern to protect children's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the need to work in close partnership with parents and other professionals to ensure continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging positive behaviour to help children to respect and value others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
