The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to promote children's welfare. She uses a range of tools, such as risk assessments and policies to help her provide a safe learning environment for children. She is knowledgeable about safeguarding and knows what procedures to follow if she has any concerns about children.
- The childminder understands how to support children's learning and development. She has a good variety of resources to help build on children's skills. The childminder knows the importance of working with any other settings children attend to help provide continuity and consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of teaching children about the diversity of the wider world. She knows how to plan activities to support children's learning and development, and support them as they move on to school. The childminder knows how to encourage positive behaviour and to teach children about healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder reflects on her strengths and weaker areas of her practice and makes plans for ongoing development and improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
