## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The manager and staff have addressed the recommendations set at the last inspection. This demonstrates that there is a strong desire for continuous improvement and to further develop the setting. Staff have regular supervision and training opportunities and teach children about healthy lifestyles
- Arrangements for safeguarding are effective. Staff understand how to keep children safe and know what to do if they have concerns about a child's welfare.
- Staff demonstrate a clear understanding of how to promote children's positive behaviour by being calm, responsive and good role models for children.
- Staff know the importance of planning an interesting range of activities. Play spaces are welcoming and safe. Staff know to allow children to make decisions about what they want to do. Staff understand the need to supervise children well and know how to complement children's learning at school.
- Staff understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to ensure children's needs are met.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises used when providing care for the children.
- The inspector talked to staff and children at appropriate times during the inspection.
- The inspector checked evidence relating to the suitability of staff.
- The inspector took account of the written views of parents.
- The inspector held meetings with the manager of the club. The inspector sampled a selection of documentation, including safeguarding procedures, performance management and the club's self-evaluation record.

B.O.O.T.S registered in 2012. The setting employs three members of childcare staff, of whom two hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3. The out-of-school provision operates Monday to Friday from 7.30am to 9am and 3pm to 6pm during school term time. There is also a holiday club, which operates from 8am to 6pm during school holidays.
