## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of her responsibility to protect children from harm. She knows how to recognise and report any concerns about a child's welfare. She offers a safe and welcoming environment for children.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's good health, for example, by offering nutritious meals and teaching simple personal hygiene routines.
- The childminder knows how to plan activities to help each child progress in their learning. She understands how to assess children's development and help them gain the skills they need for school.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents to provide continuity in their children's learning and care.
- The childminder knows how to help children behave well and value each other.
- The childminder recognises the importance of reflecting on her practice and continually developing her skills and knowledge. For instance, since the previous inspection she has obtained a relevant childcare qualification.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she will keep children safe and protect them from potential harm.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will meet children's individual needs and plan for their learning.
- The inspector looked at a selection of the records the childminder keeps when childminding.
- The inspector looked around the areas of the childminder's home that will be used by children.
