

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

On 20 March 2017 we carried out a monitoring visit, following an inspection where the provider was found to be inadequate. As a result of the inspection we sent the provider a welfare requirements notice and actions to improve. The welfare requirements notice required the provider to comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirements: 3.20 Staff qualifications, training, support and skills, 3.45 Medicines, 3.50 Accident or injury and 3.52 Managing behaviour. The actions to improve required the provider to comply with the requirements, LD2 Education programmes and 3.20 Staff qualifications, training, support and skills.

During the monitoring visit the inspector assessed the progress the provider had made. The inspector found that following her inspection the provider made contact with the local authority who are now offering support. The provider has bought both medicine and accident record books to ensure she is compliant with requirements. She has made herself aware of how these should be used to ensure children's safety. The provider has also purchased some new resources and arranged all her resources in a way that allows children to choose for themselves. This helps to avoid them becoming bored, possibly leading to incidents of poor behaviour.

The local authority school readiness team have been supporting the provider to understand more about the learning and development requirements, and are helping her to identify gaps in her knowledge. There are future visits planned as it is likely it will take time for the provider to become confident in this aspect of children's care.

Following the visit, we sent the provider an action notice that asked them to: 'continue to develop observation and planning systems to ensure all areas of children's learning are equally promoted' (The Early Years Foundation Stage

General Welfare Requirements – Education programmes LD2) and 'develop your teaching skills to encourage children to develop their own ideas and express themselves effectively' (The Early Years Foundation Stage General Welfare Requirements – Staff qualifications, training, support and skills 3.20).

Having considered the evidence, the provider has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement. The next step will be a full inspection.

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
