### Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of the early years foundation stage. She understands how to identify children's individual learning needs by using observations to track their progress. She knows how to plan activities which address the next steps in their learning and development.
- Safeguarding is effective. The childminder understands her responsibilities and knows what to do if she has concerns about a child's well-being or welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help provide continuity for children's care and learning.
- The childminder has appropriate arrangements to help children to lead a healthy lifestyle, such as access to a healthy diet and daily exercise to support children's physical development.
- The childminder knows how to help children behave well. She explains that she will teach children to share, be considerate and respect others.
- The childminder understands the need to drive improvement through ongoing training and by reflecting on her practice. She keeps herself up to date with changes in legislation and seeks regular training courses to develop her skills and knowledge.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
