Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She has updated her safeguarding procedures and knows what action to take and who to contact should she have any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to observe and monitor children's progress. She understands how to plan interesting and challenging activities to support children's individual learning styles and skills for the future.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children's good behaviour. She knows to set clear boundaries and use positive reinforcement.
- The childminder knows how to help children show respect to others and celebrate similarities and difference to support their awareness of diversity.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder recognises how to evaluate her practice and provision. She keeps her knowledge up to date, such as by reading practice guidance and current legislation.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector and childminder discussed her knowledge of safeguarding, risk assessments, child development and self-evaluation.
- The inspector sampled the childminders policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her practice and plans for improvement.
- The inspector viewed areas of the home and garden used by children.
- The inspector looked at evidence of the suitability of adults working and living on the premises.
