## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The manager knows her responsibilities to safeguard children. She understands how to ensure staff know the signs that would give them child protection concerns and the appropriate reporting arrangements to follow.
- The staff know how to follow the policies and risk assessments to help ensure the premises are safe, and secure, and to support their daily practice in protecting children from harm.
- Staff understand the importance of sharing information with parents to keep them informed about their children's time spent at the club and to identify and support children's individual needs.
- The manager and staff understand the importance of working in partnership with the school that children attend, to provide continuity for children's experiences.
- Staff know how to help children follow a healthy lifestyle. They understand how to provide healthy snacks and daily physical activities. They know how to help children learn to stay safe and behave well.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the provider how they intend to deliver activities for children.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the provider and viewed documentation they will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the provider how they deliver the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability of the provider and staff.
- The inspector toured the premises and viewed some of the resources to be used with children.

Buzzie Beas Ltd registered in 2014. The club operates from a classroom in the school grounds. Opening times are Monday to Friday, from 8am until 8.55am and from 3.15pm until 6pm. A holiday club operates during school holidays from 8am until 6pm. A team of eight regular staff care for the children and of these, five hold early years qualifications at level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register.
