Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a current first-aid qualification which potentially compromises children's health in the event of an accident.
- The childminder is aware of child protection issues and understands her responsibility to protect the welfare of children in her care.
- The childminder has varied and age-appropriate resources available. She knows how to plan activities to support children's individual learning and development needs.
- The childminder knows how to make her premises safe, secure and fit for purpose. She understands how to undertake appropriate risk assessments to help minimise hazards.
- The childminder recognises the need to build effective links with other providers and share information between other professionals and parents. She regularly reviews her provision to achieve continuous improvement and development.
- The childminder knows how to help children to form secure relationships and develop their self-esteem. She understands how to manage children's behaviour positively.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of providing children with a choice of healthy snacks, as well as a range of opportunities for physical exercise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
