## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder fully understands her responsibility to safeguard children and knows how to report any concerns she may have about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to assess, plan activities and develop children's learning to help them make progress and support them in developing the skills they need for school.
- The childminder has procedures to follow to help her get to know children before they attend. She recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to support children's individual needs.
- The childminder has high expectations of children and understands how to manage their behaviour in a positive way.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to develop healthy lifestyles. She plans to provide children with opportunities to be active.
- The childminder has a suitable range of resources to meet the learning needs of all ages of children.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her provision, to improve her service and outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions about the childminder's understanding of how young children learn and how she intends to promote their learning and development.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the safeguarding requirements, including wider safeguarding issues and knowledge of how to respond to any concerns.
- The inspector took account of the views of parents through written feedback provided.
- The inspector discussed policies and procedures with the childminder and examined documentation she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector toured the areas of the home intended for the use of childminding.

The childminder registered in 2000 and lives in Leeds, West Yorkshire. She operates all year round from 7am to 9am and 3.15pm to 6pm, Monday to Friday term time, and provides sessions in school holidays from 9am to 3.30pm, except bank holidays and family holidays.
