## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The experienced childminder has made significant changes since her previous inspection. For example, she has knowledge of the documentation requirements and has all the necessary procedures and policies in place.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health, for example, by providing healthy snacks. She teaches children about following good health and hygiene routines.
- The childminder seeks training opportunities to develop and build on her existing knowledge to improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. She understands her role and responsibilities in reporting any child protection concerns. The childminder knows how to take necessary steps to keep her home safe and secure for children.
- The childminder knows how to plan for different ages and stages of children's development using information she gathers from observations and assessments.
- The childminder has a range of age-appropriate resources and equipment to support children's learning and meet their care needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector and childminder discussed the impact of safeguarding training the childminder has attended.
- The inspector sampled relevant documentation, such as those relating to relevant policies, first aid and insurance.
- The inspector and childminder discussed the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The childminder and inspector discussed resources and viewed areas of the house used for childminding.

The childminder registered in 1990. She lives in Gosport, Hampshire. The childminder provides care Monday to Friday and on a Sunday. She operates from 6.30am to 6pm, throughout the year. There were no children present at the time of the inspection.
