## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- Safeguarding is ineffective. The manager does not know how to recognise the signs and symptoms of abuse and the designated safeguarding person has not attended a child protection training course. They lack knowledge of the procedures to report concerns or what to do if an allegation is made against a member of staff. This is also a breach of the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The leaders do not understand how to plan a programme of activities to capture children's interests and inspire them to join in. This was raised as an area for improvement at the previous inspection but has not been addressed.
- The leaders know how to organise staff and maintain appropriate staffing ratios.
- The manager knows how to support children's health and physical well-being.
- The manager demonstrates that he is able to work cooperatively with parents and exchange information to support continuity of care for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

Kidz Adventure Zone registered in 2008. The out-of-school provision operates from a children's indoor physical activity centre in Wood Green, within the London Borough of Haringey. The setting opens Monday to Friday from 3pm until 6.30pm, during term time. It also opens Monday to Friday during school holidays, from 8.30am until 6.30pm. The provider employs five members of staff, including the manager. Of these, three hold appropriate childcare qualifications at level 2 and level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
