Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Since her last inspection, the childminder has increased her understanding of how to reflect on her practice, working in partnership with parents and keeping Ofsted informed of any significant changes in the provision.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities and the importance of safeguarding children. She is aware of the signs and symptoms of harm and neglect and the procedures she must follow in the event of a concern about a child in her care. The childminder guides her assistant to ensure they are fully aware of how to safeguard children.
- The childminder and her assistant hold first-aid certificates. The childminder describes how she will care for children in the event of an accident or if they became unwell in her care. The childminder discusses how parents will be informed at the earliest opportunity.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She describes activities she will organise to support children to develop skills in their communication and language and their personal, social and emotional development.
- The childminder describes how she will introduce children to food from a variety of cultures and use the local area to help children to learn about the world around them and differences in people in our society.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder throughout the inspection.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's home that are used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and promote children's progress.
- The inspector checked a range of documentation including the suitability checks of adults living on the premises, training certificates and policies.
