Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider and staff have a clear understanding of safeguarding children and the procedures to follow if they have any concerns regarding children's welfare.
- The provider demonstrates her knowledge of behaviour management. She knows how to work together with staff and teachers to support children's understanding of sharing and working together.
- The provider understands the importance of staff working together with children to plan activities based on their interests, and to gather their views to shape routines and activities.
- The provider understands the importance of working in partnership with parents, to share any feedback from the teachers and how their children have been at the club. The provider knows how to gather parents' views to shape the service provided and to help provide continuity of care for the children.
- The provider understands how to carry out ongoing suitability checks on staff to help make sure they are suitable for their roles in caring for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector spoke with the provider and staff at appropriate times during the inspection.
- The inspector sampled documents, including safeguarding policies and procedures and for staff suitability.
- The inspector observed the premises to review safety.

The Have Some Fun Kidz Club operates from a large school hall in St Paul's Cray, Kent. The club is open each weekday from 3.15pm to 6pm, for 38 weeks of the year. The club employs six members of staff, five of whom hold relevant qualifications at level 2 and above.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register.
