## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates knowledge of child protection issues. She explains the action she plans to take if she has concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder describes how she intends to gather information about children's development when they first start at the setting. She explains how she plans to observe children playing and plan activities to support them to make progress.
- The childminder explains how she intends to keep parents well informed about their child's development. For example, she aims to use an online system to share assessment information and encourage parents to share learning from home.
- The childminder recognises the importance of reflecting on the quality of her setting. She describes how she intends to use parents' views to identify further improvements needed.
- The childminder explains how she plans to create an inclusive setting. She aims to teach children how to value and respect differences in others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector and childminder toured the premises where childcare is to be provided. The inspector and the childminder discussed toys, resources and equipment that she intends to use.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's suitability and the suitability of all people living and working on the premises.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed policies and documents the childminder plans to use when caring for children and discussed self-evaluation with the childminder.
