## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows what action to take if she has concerns about a child's welfare. She has attended relevant training and has suitable policies and procedures to which to refer.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to promote children's learning and development. She understands the relevance to observe children, assess their progress, and use this information to inform the planning in the next steps of individual learning. She understands how and what activities to provide to support children's development.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's good health, their emotional well-being, and physical development. The childminder knows how to promote children's good behaviour to help them build positive relationships.
- The childminder knows to regularly seek the views of parents and undertake regular training to help improve the quality of all aspects of the provision. The childminder has addressed previous weakness identified at the last inspection.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to work in partnership with parents, and other settings children may attend, to promote continuity of care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas of the childminder's home used when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of the learning and development requirements, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the systems of self-evaluation the childminder uses for improving her knowledge and practice further.
- The inspector sampled policies and procedures, a range of documents the childminder uses when minding, and evidence of suitability of adults living in the home.

The childminder registered in 2011. She lives in Chadwell Heath, in the London Borough of Redbridge. She operates Monday to Friday from 7.30am to 6.30pm, all year round, with the exception of public holidays and family holidays.
