## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The manager has addressed the action and recommendation raised at the last inspection. Staff have regular supervision and training opportunities. The manager and staff carry out self-evaluation to identify areas of practice to strengthen. They discuss how to use parents' and children's views to target improvements.
- Safeguarding is effective. Staff understand how to keep children safe and know how to report concerns about children. The manager discusses how to use the key-person system to help meet children's emotional needs and to help them settle.
- The manager understands the importance of establishing partnerships with the host schools. She discusses how to provide activities that complement the learning experiences that take place in school.
- The manager understands how to support children to develop healthy lifestyles. Staff provide healthy snacks and opportunities for children to have daily physical exercise. She discusses how to promote children's independence and how to encourage them to make decisions about what they want to do.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises used when providing care for the children.
- The inspector discussed the manager's knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector held meetings with the manager of the club. The inspector sampled a selection of documentation, including safeguarding procedures, performance management and the club's self-evaluation record.
- The inspector checked evidence relating to the suitability of staff.

Dean Hole Out of School Club registered in 2000. The club employs four members of childcare staff. All staff hold appropriate early years qualifications, including one at level 2 and three at level 3. The club opens from Monday to Friday during term time. Sessions are from 8am until 8.50am and from 3.30pm until 5.30pm.
