The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to maintain a current first-aid certificate as required.
- The childminder has an understanding of safeguarding procedures. She is aware of what to do if she has any child protection concerns.
- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's progress. She understands how to plan activities that help children make progress and prepare them for school.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote children's health. For example, she understands the importance of providing daily exercise and healthy foods.
- The childminder recognises how to teach children to value and respect others. She knows how to help children learn about right and wrong.
- The childminder is aware of how to work in partnership with parents to help provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the value of reviewing practice and identifying areas for development that help improve children's experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
