The provision meets requirements

- The childminder communicates suitable knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements and current child protection issues. She has clear policies and procedures in place to help her keep any children she cares for safe and healthy.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her provision, to improve her service and outcomes for children. For example, she knows how to continue with her own professional development to improve her knowledge and understanding and to keep up to date with any changes and requirements.
- The childminder understands the importance of working together with parents and early years professionals, to support children's all-round development needs.
- The childminder has suitable toys and resources for children of all age ranges and knows how to positively manage children's behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
