## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not addressed the action raised at the time of the last inspection. She does not understand how to plan activities and offer support to promote the next steps in children's learning.
- The childminder knows how to identify the expected stages of development of, for example, a baby and a pre-school child.
- The childminder understands the content of her safeguarding policy. She identifies the signs of harm and neglect, and the local referral procedures to follow to protect children. She know how to minimise potential risks in her home and garden.
- The childminder seeks support from a representative of the local authority to help her improve her provision, and she has made progress in her understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She keeps her safeguarding and first-aid knowledge current and has completed online training, including behaviour management.
- The childminder understands her role to provide information for parents, such as through written policies about her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
