### Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe in her home. She knows who to contact if she has concerns about the welfare of any child in her care.
- The childminder is aware of the need to observe and assess children's learning and development to help plan activities that interest and engage them. She knows how to monitor children's learning to support them to make progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to provide continuity of care for children.
- The childminder is aware of the need to evaluate her practice and keep her knowledge up to date.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting good behaviour, kindness and respect for others to help support children's personal development and their well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes and evaluate her practice.
