## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps her safeguarding knowledge current and has completed further training to cover wider safeguarding issues. She knows what action to take and whom to contact should she have any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to observe and monitor children's progress. She knows how to plan a range of activities that supports children's individual learning styles. She is aware of the importance of supporting children in readiness for school.
- The environment is a safe and an interesting place for children to play. The childminder has a range of resources which she has displayed so children can make independent choices in what they want to do.
- The childminder recognises how to support children's good behaviour. She sets clear boundaries and uses positive reinforcement to develop their personal and social skills.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents and others involved in the children's care to provide continuity in their care and learning.
- The childminder recognises the value of reflecting on her practice and making plans for ongoing developments to help improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
