Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows how to safeguard children's welfare to protect them from harm and how to minimise risks to help keep them safe in her care.
- The childminder knows how to support children's development and how to assess their learning to help them make progress. She understands how to plan a range of activities to keep children interested throughout the day.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children develop skills to promote their future learning and move to school. For instance she knows how to help children develop good communication skills, self-confidence and independence.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to support children's health and well-being and to extend their learning at home.
- The childminder provides a range of resources to support children's learning.
- The childminder recognises the value of professional development and evaluating her practice to make improvements to children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements, and improvements made since the last inspection.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to promote children's learning and development.
- The inspector looked at the documents the childminder plans to use when caring for children and discussed her policies.
- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and the resources she plans to use.
