- The childminder understands her responsibility to promote children's learning and development. She discusses the appropriate arrangements she intends to use to observe and assess children's interests and abilities and plan for their future learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding procedures. She knows her role to protect children and undertakes regular training to update her knowledge.
- The childminder understands the importance of using a range of effective and consistent strategies to promote children's positive behaviour.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with a healthy diet and regular exercise to promote their well-being. She has a wide range of resources and describes how she will use these to help children make progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder has procedures in place to help children settle in and to help her to communicate with parents so she gets to know children before they start.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
